Pupil Premium Statement September 2015

Every school has a duty to ensure that every individual child is given the best possible chance of achieving their potential.

The government provides Pupil Premium funding which is in addition to main school funding to help address national inequalities between the achievements of children eligible for free school meals or children in care when compared with their wealthier peers.

EBN Academy Trust accesses pupil premium for students who are on our school role. For students remaining on other network schools roles, we do not have access to pupil premium funding.

For 2014/15, pupil premium was spent on those students who are in receipt of free school meals (FSM) accessing the following interventions:

- Academic mentor
- One to one personal coaching
- Additional therapy sessions from teachers
- Additional vocational qualifications
- Literacy and numeracy interventions

2015/16

Plans for spending Pupil premium for 2015/16 centre on the following priorities

- A focus on core subjects English, Maths and Science, including continued and increased focus on literacy and numeracy interventions.
- Continued strengthening of the mentoring team with the employment of a full time careers advisor.
- Subsidies for participation in extra curriculum activities and visits and a focus in the provision of an extensive extra curriculum program
